

2011 Canadian Nationals

Edmonton Alberta

The 10th Canadian National Handball Championships held in Edmonton, Alberta since 1970 proved to be one of the very best tournaments......ever! The bar has been raised once again for all future Nationals to be held in Canada.

The event was hosted at the University of Alberta at the Van Vliet Court Facility. The court facility has two glass back show courts and 4 sold wall courts. Hospitality was hosted in the Faculty Lounge in the "Butterdome" recreation facility with both breakfast and lunch being served along with full refreshments. The tournament began Wednesday with a "FUN" 1-WALL EVENT. The morning session had Senior players, some who had never tried 1-wall before and enjoyed the outdoor court facility at the World 2006 Legacy 1-wall court in Sherwood Park. The afternoon session had Junior players, who also enjoyed the outdoor 1wall with both singles and doubles being played. The exposure of 1-wall for all players, and those who wish to pursue the game, which will become the "handball future" as 4-wall courts begin to diminish in numbers. A Junior High School was set up for 1-wall in the event of in climate weather.

The Alberta, Edmonton and Sherwood Park Handball Associations were very pleased to also have two of the very best handball players in the World attend to not only compete, but to host both Junior and Senior handball clinics. Coaching clinics at this level from both David Chapman and David Fink had all those attending in awe of both these great athletic individuals but also the message, " you can always get better at your game of handball".

Although the player numbers were down over previous Nationals, the bright light was over 40 Juniors attending playing in all Junior events. Juniors and coaches were from Newfoundland, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and both Calgary and Edmonton. The Richard Kearney Junior Award was presented to the Alberta Junior Teams from Calgary and Edmonton. There are currently over 24 juniors active in the sports in Alberta and this is a huge growth and accolades from the Calgary coach, Bill McGrath and Edmonton coach, Jennifer Martin. The Rene Hurley Award went to Rhiannon Cooper of St John's, Newfoundland. Both of these awards are in honour of former handball players, both Senior and Junior who have left a legacy of what handball means to all that play our game.

The final wind-up banquet was held at the Lister Convention Centre, U of Alberta on Saturday evening. Guest MC was Mark Connolly of CBC Sports fame. Mark has reported on over 6 Summer and Winter Olympics and is a former Junior Handball Player in Edmonton. Guest Speaker was Georgette Reed, U of Alberta Track Head Coach and is a former Olympic and Pan Am Games shot put and discus champion. Entertainment was provided by a World Class Hoola Hooper and the evening dance started with a Belly Dancer bringing onto the dance floor both Junior and Senior handball players.

The highlight of the evening was the induction of BRIAN GOTO former Canadian Handball President into the 2011 CANADIAN HANDBALL HALL OF FAME. Brian's contribution to Canadian Handball is legendary. As a High School teacher in Burlington, Ontario, he established 1-wall indoor and outdoor courts in the school system and then bringing students to experience 4-wall as well. Many of his former students obtained USA College Handball Scholarships with many becoming champions. Brian's efforts through his tenure with the CHA has not only improved the quality of handball being played in Canada, but also the exposure to handball in both the USA and Ireland. Brian's lovely wife, Sandy, and his two daughters did a power point presentation, with many great memories brought out. Al Campbell of Hamilton, ON introduced Brian, Rob Pearse of Chattanooga, TN had many wonderful words to say as a former student, and a surprise to Brian was his former doubles partner from Hamilton, ON Jim Turnbull showed up to say a few words. Congratulations, Brian Goto.

As always, a successful tournament does not go without the guidance of a sold committee of volunteers. Both Skip Smiley and Howard Strettle were very fortunate to have such a committee. 2011 June Hill Junior 1-Wall Handball Tournament

2011 June Hill Junior 1-Wall Handball Tournament

The 2011 June Hill Memorial 1-Wall Junior Handball Tournament (Parts I & II) were recently held at Brant Hills Public School, located in Burlington, Ontario. On June 4th, the bright smiles on the faces of the junior players, were unfortunately disrupted after a couple of hours, by an intense hail storm. If someone had been able to grab a water-proof camera, footage of the attempts to close the Peak Powersports tent in the high winds, would certainly have gone viral. The tournament was continued 3-weeks later, on a cloudy, but dry day.

Highlights of the tournament include:

- In preparation for the event, the OHA re-painted the 4-outdoor courts located at Brant Hills Public School. This will provide a centrally located venue for future 1-Wall events in Ontario.

- Following a spirited round-robin format, the 1st Ontario Junior 1-Wall Champions were crowned:
 - Elementary Boys Division: Alam Burgos from Fort Erie.
 - High School Boys Division: Matt Shrum from Smithville.

 Girls Division: shared between Lisa & Loma Lipuma of Buffalo, NY, and Danita Guest & Sydney Knight of Newmarket.

Thanks to Harold McLean for refurbishing and donating all of the division trophies.

- Thanks also go out to Brad Warren, Jenine Wilson-Cramp, Harold McLean, Fernando Burgos and Chris Reynolds for helping to coach and referee the matches. Bowler Has Hat Trick

As told by Edwin Pritchard

The 2011 Ontario 3-wall Tournament, the John Choma Memorial, was held on Saturday, August 20th under sunny skies.




