One item that that past president Doug Santha started that we would like to put out there now is the 2012 Worlds in Ireland. Brian and I are looking into the possibility of a Team shirt for Canadian players attending the Worlds (and supporters who will be staying home). At this time we are not sure how many from each province will be attending. We have reached out to the provincial reps and are awaiting feedback. In the meantime if you plan to attend the Worlds this year please send us an email and let us know if you would be interested in purchasing a "Team" shirt. It would be great if all of our Canadian players we recognized throughout their travels for the Worlds in Ireland.

Another significant announcement is the creation of a World Wall Ball Association.

Here is a description directly from their proposed constitution.

"The "World Wall Ball Association" (WWBA), an Association of international representative organisation, is established within the federations of Handball sports, which includes the "World Handball Council" (WHC), the Confederation Internationale du Jeux de Balle (CIJB) and the GAA Handball Association. (GAAHA)."

"The primary aim of the not for profit organisation will be foster the development of the 'One Wall game' and International Direct Game (the rules of the game are attached in appendix one) as an international sport that will seek to achieve full status as an Olympic sport. The organisation will also develop and execute a strategic plan to promote, develop and grow the numbers participating in the sport on a global basis." Brian and I are getting up to speed on this exciting opportunity and will forward more information as we receive it. The CHA's initial response was to support the start up of the organization and the growth of handball. The CHA will continue to monitor this initiative and will advise the CHA board and provincial reps accordingly. Please direct any comments to your provincial rep or directly to Brian and myself.

Again, we are looking forward to working with everyone in strengthening handball at the Provincial and National levels.

Women's Commissioner Report

Overall, there is consistent participation from junior girls throughout the provinces. Newfoundland, Alberta and Saskatchewan have been having female junior representation at the Canadian Nationals for several years now. In Ontario, as a result of our junior co-ordinator Wally Oprzedek, there has been an increase in the introduction of handball to female athletes. Two phys-ed groups (consisting of females ages 15-17) were introduced to handball and a handful of them continue to play- mostly 1 wall.

My goal continues to be to encourage the introduction and participation of females playing handball. Similarly to the development of junior programs, this takes time and ongoing effort. A lot of the interest seems to stem from the introduction to the 1 wall game.....and from that, branching out to 4 wall. Whatever gets new participants playing the game, whether 1 wall or 4 is an encouraging sign....getting them to stick with the sport is an additional challenge that we'll continue to face.

A facebook page remains in place titled "Women in the World of Handball". Many women from all over the world belong to this group, which in conjunction with email and other message boards has increased communication within the community. My personal goal as the Women's Commissioner is to attend at least 2 clinics in Ontario in an effort to encourage the female athletes to continue playing and offer support as a fellow female player. I welcome any questions, suggestions or feedback in helping to grow and maintain the sport.


